

A frightened little boy was led into Juvenile Court by a case worker. This was his day in court. The kind judge looked down at the pathetic figure and his heart went out to the boy, as he asked, "What are the charges?"

The case worker replied, "There are no charges against the boy, sir. You see, it's his home situation."

Yes, the judge was all too familiar with the story—parents drinking and fighting; the little boy roaming the streets—anything to keep from going home; crying himself to sleep at night, thinking no one loves him. Now his parents were separated and neither of them wanted him.

What could he do? What could the case worker do? What could the judge do?
